



Downtown Parking Area Restrictions

(1) Except as provided in subsections (B)(2), (3), (4) or (5), no person shall, while at his/her place of employment when the place of employment abuts the downtown parking area, cause, allow, suffer or permit any motor vehicle owned by that person to be parked in any one or more parking spaces upon the public streets within the downtown parking area between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on any day.

(2) This section shall not apply on Sundays or state holidays.

(3) Vehicles owned by employees shall be allowed to load or unload their vehicle for a maximum period of 30 minutes in the downtown parking area.

(4) This section shall not apply to any vehicle owned by an employee but being operated by someone other than the employee.

(5) This section shall not apply to a vehicle operated by a person over 65 years of age, or which has been identified as a vehicle used by or for a disabled person under Ch. 487 of Oregon laws when the vehicle is actually used by or for the disabled person.

(C) Employee parking prohibited. No employee shall cause a vehicle owned by that person to be parked on a public street within the downtown parking area except within an individually marked parking space. ORD. 72.14

Common Violations

- Vehicles parked on the street to display the vehicle for sale.
 - Vehicles parked on the street more than 12 inches from the curb.
 - Vehicles parked on the street with flat tires or expired registration.
 - Vehicles parked on the street facing the incorrect direction for the flow of traffic (ex: parked facing north on the southbound side of the road).
 - Vehicles parked in an alleyway for longer than 20 consecutive minutes.
 - Vehicles parked on the street for longer than 10 consecutive days.
 - Recreational vehicles, travel trailers, cargo trailers, boats, etc. parked on the street for longer than 72 hours.

DID YOU KNOW?

The fine for violating a City Ordinance may be up to **\$500 per occurrence**. The issuance of a fine does not relieve the duty to correct the violation.



No operator shall park and no owner shall allow a vehicle to be parked on a street for the principal purpose of the following.

- (1) Displaying the vehicle for sale.
- (2) Repairing or servicing the vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency.
- (3) Displaying temporary advertising from the vehicle.
- (4) Selling merchandise from the vehicle, except when authorized.
