

RESOLUTION NO. 661

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING GOALS FOR THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE, SAID GOALS TO BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1989.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Prineville has decided that setting the accomplishment of specified goals to be in the best interest of the City of Prineville, and

WHEREAS, a work session of the City Council concerning the setting of specified goals was held on February 13, 1988, and


WHEREAS, the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989, was set as the deadline for the accomplishment of specified goals,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE THAT THE FOLLOWING LISTED GOALS BE THE OFFICIAL GOALS DESIRABLE TO BE ACHIEVED PRIOR TO THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1989:


1. That the City sewer system be extended along South Main Street from SE 5th Street to Lynn Boulevard, thereby allowing those residences within this area having failed septic drain fields to hook onto the City sewer system.
2. That a medium- and long-term plan for orderly annexation be developed for those areas lying outside the present City limits that would logically utilize and need services to be provided by the City.
3. That the City resolve the problem of ground water infiltration into the City sewer as the problem currently exists in the northwest section of the City.
4. That the City develop an Economic Development Plan that encourages the filling of the City and County's industrial parks and the downtown area.
5. That the City develop a timetable for the implementation of the City's "Water Facilities Plan".
6. That the City develop a long-range records storage plan.
7. That the City develop an effective Public Relations and Information plan.
8. That the City evaluate the feasibility of a "wellness" program for City employees.
