

RESOLUTION NO. 393

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR SEWER HOOKUPS; SETTING PRIORITIES AND PROVIDING FOR APPEAL TO THE CITY COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, The City sewer interceptor line is operating near capacity; and

WHEREAS, The City Engineer has recommended new sewer hookups be limited to 200; and

WHEREAS, The City Council wishes to establish a policy for the allocation of said remaining 200 hookups on a priority basis;


NOW THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL DOES HEREBY RESOLVE:

- Section 1. Existing structures. That all existing structures available to the City Sewer but not connected be given notice to connect to the said City Sewer within 30 days or forego their priority to connect to City Sewer.
- Section 2. Structures Under Construction. That all structures that are presently under construction be allocated hookups to City Sewer service;
- Section 3. Contractual Agreement. The City will recognize contract agreements with subdividers to the extent that it does not cause overloading of the sewer interceptor lines;
- Section 4. New Construction. Any remaining unallocated hookups to the City Sewer after the foregoing priorities have been satisfied shall be granted on a first come first served basis, based upon issuance of building permits.
- Section 5. Health, Safety & Welfare. The City Council shall discontinue all new sewer connections when advised by the City Engineer that the existing sewer lines are operating at capacity. The City Council may also authorize connections to City sewer service if in said Council's opinion the connection is necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the City.
- Section 6. Appeal. Any person aggrieved by the denial of a permit to hookup to the existing sewer may appeal to the City Council in writing within 30 days after said denial.
